Williams applied for 160 acres on the western edge of Kettenpom Valley, but was approved entry for only 40 acres. The location of the tract is very problematic and it is plotted on the Base Map (in dashed lines) based somewhat on topography since the original GLO survey was so inaccurate. Refer to F10 from more information on problems plotting tracts in this area on the Base Map.


The *Report on Agricultural Settlement* dated December 5, 1907, noted that Williams, who had no family, first filed for entry in 1907 on a tract that turned out to already be patented land (the problem was probably related to the inaccurate GLO surveys note the highly irregular Section lines in this area):

Claimant camped on the land during the Spring months of 1907, and built brush fence around 10 acres of land, but the enclosed land was not embraced by his entry, but is located on patented land owned by Geo. Merritt information received from Alexander Espie a man living on adjoining claim.

He then filed an amended entry on this parcel of land. MRRD Ranger Gray, who inspected the entry claim on December 2, 1907 noted that much of the tract was "...more valuable for timber than any other purpose." Therefore, while the original claim was for 160 acres only 40 acres were approved for entry.

There were no buildings on the tract when Williams filed for entry. It appears that this tract was never listed. Williams does not show up on the 1910 census and none of the consultants or historic documents referenced mention his name. It is likely that given the problems with this tract of land, he did not live here very long. The portions of tract were eventually withdrawn by TNF for administrative purposes for the Hoaglin Guard Station (see NF01 and Base Map) and it is shown as FS land (and private lands owned at that time by Merritt) on TNF and SRNF maps.
